Second Nature - Water Conservation & Environmental Justice

Today we learned

We can be environmental stewards for water! We learned about ways to **conserve** water in our daily lives and the importance of keeping litter off our streets and out of our water systems! We also learned about **environmental justice** and the importance that everyone in our community, despite their socio economic and cultural backgrounds, have the right to access clean water.

Now at home

Have a chat with your child about what they learned today! Discuss ways that you conserve water at home and try to think of new habits that your family can implement to save water!

One place in our home that we use a lot of water is the bathroom! Brainstorm some ways you can conserve water during your daily routine. Remind your child that although we want to conserve water, it doesn't mean that we have to give up our hygiene practices. Water conservation just means we want to use only the amount of water that we need!

Create a Shower Race Log like the one below. Place the log and a timer in the bathroom. Encourage your household to log the length of each shower next to their name. Add up the recorded time to see who conserved the most water!
